MINUTES

Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Eastern Shore of Virginia Broadband Authority

July 22, 2021

Board members in attendance were: John Reiter, Mike Mason, Kelvin Pettit, and Elaine Meil.

ESVBA management participating in the meeting who were in attendance: Robert Bridgham and Leah Hoopes (Secretary)

Members of the public attending were: Patrick Coady, Mike Zodun, Carol Moran, Sue Mastyl

Ms. Reiter called the meeting to order at 2:00 pm.

AGENDA ADOPTION

Ms. Meil moved to adopt the agenda. Mr. Mason seconded. Motion passed unopposed.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Carol Moran (Central) asked for an explanation on the amount she was quoted for install and the process after the fiber is installed.

REVIEW OF MINUTES

Ms. Meil moved to approve the Annual Meeting Minutes and the Regular Board Meeting Minutes from May. Mr. Mason seconded. Motion passed unopposed.

SYSTEM STATUS & BUILD REPORT

- 1. WiFi Hotspots- There are currently 25 hotspots in service. The construction for McComas Park should be completed in the next few weeks.
- 2. Residential Broadband- Mr. Bridgham reported that the Authority has 1670 active residential customers. He stated that there are 50 customers in service in Harborton, 22 in Bobtown,

70 in Church Neck, 58 in Sanford, 34 on Cheapside, 4 on Cobbs Station, 80 in Accomac, 6 in Townsend, 67 in Greenbackville, 62 in Atlantic, 49 in Wattsville/Horntown, 64 in Oak Hall, 78 in Hallwood, 40 in Painter/Quinby, 48 in Eastville, 44 in Nassawadox, 9 in Oyster, 161 in Exmore, 52 in Belle Haven, 44 in Cheriton, 30 in Wachapreague, 254 in Onancock, 207 in Cape Charles, 95 in Parksley, 5 in Nocks Landing, 33 in Saxis, and 4 on Chincoteague.

Ms. Meil asked what is the average install cost for residents. Mr. Bridgham stated that the Authority is funding about \$1200-\$1300 per install.

Mr. Bridgham announced that the Authority has brought on 2 additional underground contractors to help complete the Micro Communities.

- 3. WISP EVPL Program- Mr. Bridgham informed the BOD that 56 sites are in service, 4 new sites on-order and underway.
- 4. Microcommunity Program- There are 13 communities that are in service and 5 others that are in various stages of progress.
- **5.** EBB Program- The program had 6 subscribers in June and 24 subscribers in July.
- **6.** 2021 CARES projects in Accomack and Northampton- Mr. Bridgham reported that materials have been ordered and engineering has been complete for 37 of 56 miles and the engineering for Captains Cove has been completed.

OLD BUSINESS.

a. Rate Hearing-

Mr. Bridgham reviewed the new terms for Ethernet Transport and Dedicated Internet.

Mr. Mason moved to adopt the rates as advertised. Ms. Meil seconded. Motion passed unopposed.

NEW BUSINESS.

a. **Schedule new rate hearing-** Mr. Bridgham explained that last year all of the residential bandwidth speeds were doubled to help the community. He's requesting that the bandwidths stay doubled permanently at the same rate.

- Mr. Mason motioned to advertise the new residential rates. Ms. Meil seconded. After discussion, motion passed unopposed. The Special Meeting is scheduled for October 28, 2021 at 2pm.
- b. Consider budget amendment- Mr. Bridgham presented the 3 budget amendment requests to the BOD.

 Ms. Meil motioned to carry forward the \$40k to spend on a van.

 Mr. Reiter seconded. Motion passed unopposed.

 Ms Meil motioned to increase the line item to \$8k from the fund balance. Mr. Pettit seconded. Motion passed unopposed.

 Mr. Mason suggested holding off on item 3 until a final announcement has been made about how the state funds will be allocated
- c. **Consider ESVBA assistance program-** Mr. Bridgham presented the assistance program to the BOD.

 Ms. Meil stated that Section 8 and USDA are not federal public housing. Ms. Meil also commented that the limits on the job loss requirement were too high.

 Mr. Mason motioned to approve the perimeters for the Installation Assistance Program as provided by the Executive Director. Ms. Meil seconded. Motion passed unopposed.
- d. **Consider shore wide expansion plans-** Mr. Bridgham presented models and suggested having a subcommittee to direct the plan. Mr. Reiter requested that the subcommittee be made up of the Treasurer and the Chair. Mr. Reiter stated that the subcommittee will meet and report results by the next board meeting.
- e. **VATI application-** Mr. Bridgham explained that VATI will fund 80% of a project and the grant would help the Authority expand. He suggested building a cost project for 2 areas in Accomack county and an area in northern Northampton. Ms. Meil asked how much in funds the Authority is able to match. Mr. Bridgham replied that the Authority could match \$600k and the counties have ARPA funds available. *Ms. Meil moved to Authorize the Executive Director to develop and submit a VATI application and the Letter of Intent by the due date. Mr. Mason seconded. Motion passed unopposed.*

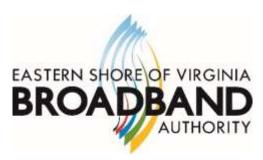
CLOSED SESSION

WISP EVPL Program

- Fifty-six (58) sites in service, two (2) new sites on-order and underway (one has been on hold for quite some time).
- Bandwidth upgrades have been provisioned for several towers and sites continue to be added.
- We are also still processing several migrations from the WISPs on the Eastern Shore

Microcommunity Program

- There now 15 microcommunities in-service and operational, 4 that are partially in-service awaiting the remaining few turn-ups, 5 additionally being constructed currently.
- We have 7 approved microcommunities representing 36-homes that have been approved and are in-progress of being constructed.

EBB Program

• As of September 1, 2021, we have 45 residents enrolled in the EBB program and have claimed and saved \$1,607.71 for those 45 people.

2021 CARES projects in Accomack & Northampton

The ESVBA has worked with both Accomack & Northampton to prepare MOUs for construction of projects in both Counties. The MOUs for both counties are complete. We have verified routes that are not currently 100% covered and notified counties for those areas that are no longer eligible as well as working on additional areas to reuse the funding. Materials have been ordered to prepare for the builds and engineering is complete for 36.68miles of extensions of the 56.13 currently planned. The Captains Cove community has been fully engineered and is ready for construction as funding becomes available. Several areas are constructed and construction is underway on others (see below).

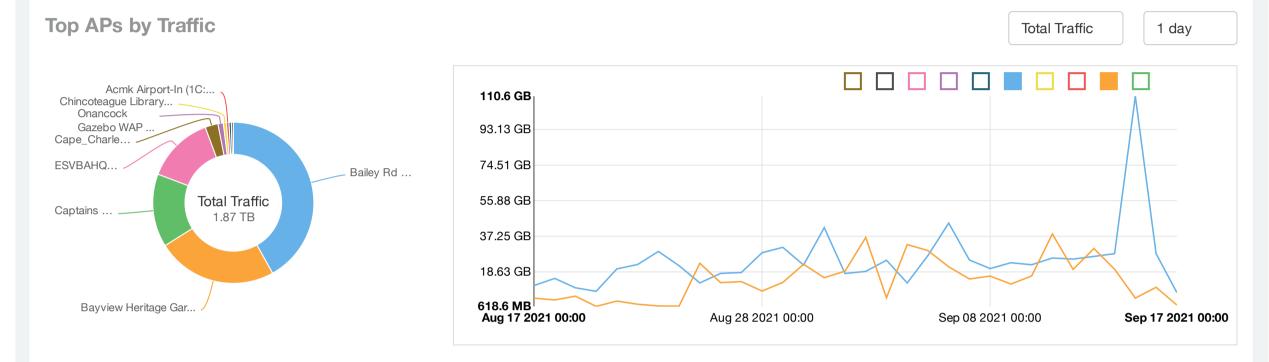

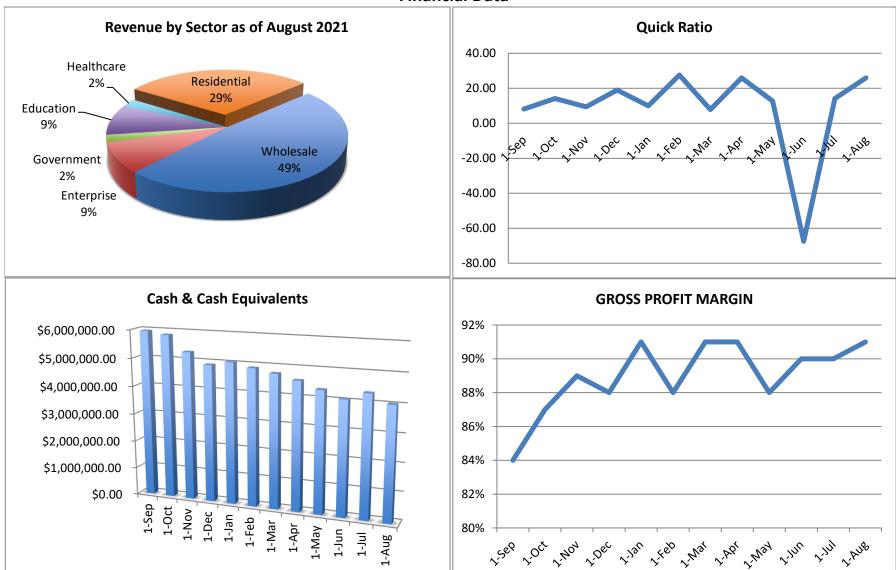

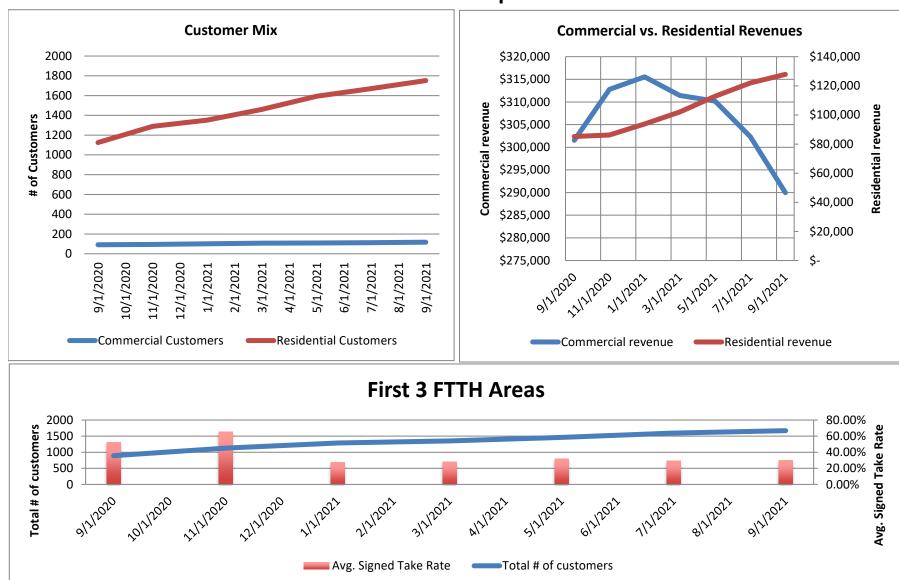


ESVBA Dashboard - September 2021

Agenda Item: Draft Board of Directors Public Comment Rules

Summary: During the ESVBA Board of Directors meetings, we want to make clear

what the rules are regarding what should and should not be allowed during the public comment periods as well as what is acceptable and how

much time each member of the public is permitted to speak

Proposed Rules:

A. Public comments shall not address matters on the public hearing calendar for the day.

- B. No individual citizen shall be permitted to address the Board for more than four (4) minutes.
- C. The chairman shall allocate the time among the speakers in an equitable manner.
- D. Individuals who have previously spoken on a subject at a public hearing shall not be allowed to readdress the Board during the citizens comment period.
- E. Specific questions should be resolved prior to the meeting by contacting a Board member or the appropriate staff member.
- F. Anyone who would like to present a PowerPoint presentation for a public meeting has to present the presentation 24 hours in advance for review by staff for appropriateness.
- G. Questions shall be directed to the Chairman, who will, at his/her discretion, solicit the response from the appropriate person.

The Chair has the right and duty to maintain proper order in accordance with these rules.

Proposed Motion:

The ESVBA Board adopt the rules as outlined above as rules for public comment during any and all future ESVBA Board of Directors meetings.
